## 1 Introduction

This deliverable is based on the website for the SENSATION project. The website is located at <http://sensation-project.eu> and is intended as a key tool both for public dissemination of results, publications, and tools, but also for information sharing and archiving internally in the SENSATION project. To facilitate both of these goals, the website is split into two general areas: the *public* area and the *internal area*, both of which are described in more detail below.

The website will be updated continuously over the course of the project and will be the main resource for project related material. Furthermore, the domain name, ‘*sensation-project.eu*’, has been acquired for at least five years, i.e., for two years beyond the expected end of the project, with an option to further extend the ownership of the domain name.

Instead of setting up and hosting a wiki, or similar technology, on the internal area of the website, it was decided for cost/benefit reasons, instead to use the Wiggio online service<sup>1</sup> for sharing work-in-progress documents, scheduling meetings, and active collaboration between partners in general. This service enables a much richer online interaction between partners than possible with an ordinary wiki. The consortium is currently in the process of collecting documentation regarding the case studies using both Wiggio and the internal area of the website.

## 2 Public Area

The public area of the website serves the purpose of introducing the project to site visitors. This includes an overview of the projects objectives and workplan (in the “About” section of the website), the project partners (in the “Contact” section), and the publications and tools of the project (in the “Publications” and “Tools” sections respectively).

The public area also contains posts and updates on current and future meetings and events related to the project.

## 3 Internal Area

The internal area is password protected and is only accessible to the SENSATION consortium and the commission. The internal area is used mainly for archiving key documents:

- Key project documents such as the DoW, the consortium agreement, and any changes/amendments to these.
- Documents relating to the management team, e.g., agendas and minutes from management team meetings.
- Templates, e.g., for deliverables and slide.
- The deliverables, reports, and other related documents generated by the project, e.g., presentations.
